

"Living the Love of God"

July is the seventh month out of twelve, making it a turning point in the flow of months. With the beginning of July I start thinking more about the fall than about the spring, and I start gearing up for the coming fall's activities. The first of those will be the Mission to Honduras. Nine people are going from New Mexico representing Silver City, Carlsbad and Las Cruces. We will join Honduras Good Works volunteers from all over the nation, 85 people going to help and be helped, to heal and be healed, and to come back transformed.

Then on into the fall: August sees the launch of the school year and the Parish Picnic and Swim Party at the Giese's, September is the beginning of Sunday School and EFM, October we bless animals, November we give thanks and December...where'd the year go!?

But such is the stuff of turning points. We look back briefly and then we turn toward the future and the changes it will bring. Every turning point in the eyes of God is an invitation to learn to be loved more deeply and therefore to love more deeply. It is a recognition that we are on a journey into the heart of God, on a path of surprises, mile-marked by turning points.

FROM YOUR RECTOR'S WARDEN

"Eternal Father, Strong to Save" was written by William Whiting, an Anglican churchman from the coast of England. God spared his life when a violent storm nearly claimed the ship on which he was traveling. It was felt to be inspired by Psalm 107. It was soon used in the US and Great Britain as the "Navy Hymn." The first verse is as follows:

Eternal Father, strong to save, Whose arm hath bound the restless wave, Who bidd'st the mighty ocean deep Its own appointed limits keep: O, hear us when we cry to Thee For those in peril on the sea!

The following verse was later added and is often used by military families:

O Christ! Whose voice the waters heard And hushed their raging at Thy word, Who walkedst on the foaming deep, And calm amidst its rage didst sleep: Oh, hear us when we cry to Thee, For those in peril on the sea!
